

Conflict of Interest Disclosure Form

Article IV § 31 of the St. Louis City Charter mandates that Board of Aldermen members and employees must report any personal or financial interests that could conflict with their duties. This requirement applies in situations where:

1. The individual could use their position to benefit personally or financially. This includes situations where the benefit extends to family members up to the fourth degree, any civic, union, social, charitable, or religious group they or their close relations are affiliated with in a significant capacity, especially when matters related to these entities come before the City in a way that involves the Board of Aldermen's business.
2. The individual or their spouse is directly involved in a labor contract that could be seen as a conflict of interest.


